February Meeting Botanical Confections

Members of the Milwaukee AACT, WIFT, & Chicago AACT organizations are invited to participate in a Confectionery Competition! Teams may submit a confection exemplifying their interpretation of "Botanical Confections"

Hibiscus, lavender, rose, and more, nature provides us with some of the most delightful flavor options. These flavors have been growing in popularity in the past few years and are expected to continue on trend. So this year we invite you to take your inspiration and ingredients from nature!

The judging will be done through a blind taste test by all attendees. A brief description submitted by each team will be read by the head judge while tasting. Each attendee will be given a score sheet to evaluate **incorporation of theme/creativity**, **flavor**, & execution. Winner will be determined by a tally of numerical scores.

Submission Requirements:

- Team name, team members, and any organizational affiliations must be included with a brief description of the confection and how it incorporates the botanical theme.
- Only 1 submission is allowed per company
- Independent teams are also welcome
- If too many submissions are made, we may need to do an elimination based on concept and/or time of submission.

Meeting Logistics:

- Each team must prepare confections for all attendees (approx. 80 pieces)
- Final count will be given 1 week prior to meeting.
- Team or team representative must come
 ½ hour before start to plate
- Each confection will be plated by number of people at each table (typically 8-10)
- Plates will be provided
